This week the theme of our assemblies has been 'Behaving Responsibly'.

To support us in talking to students, we have invited local police officers to come into school and deliver an assembly about the implications of anti-social behaviour.

Whilst we are aware that only a minority of students have been involved in this type of behaviour outside school, it is important to inform all students of the consequences of such behaviour.

We are working in partnership with the local police to ensure that our students behave responsibly in the local area and their community. The following paragraph is a message from our local police.

*Coventry Police work in partnership with schools, Coventry City Council, Whitefriars and many other organisations/agencies. Information sharing is a key element when dealing with antisocial behaviour. Responsible authorities will work together to ensure safer communities.*

*If you are experiencing anti-social behaviour in your area you can contact your local police station to discuss your concerns and work towards a lasting solution to your problem. There are several ways in which you can report anti-social behaviour to us:*
