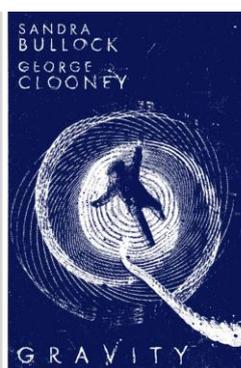
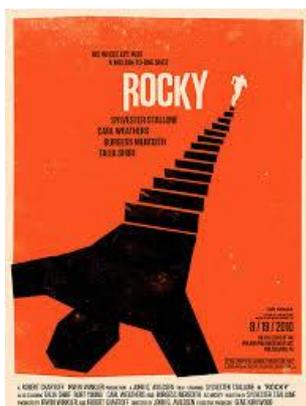
It should communicate key information about the show, such as:
